CHATEAU LOUDENNE, MÉDOC

Originally built in the 17th century, Château Loudenne is one of the oldest Médoc properties. It is now owned and operated by the Lafragette family.

This picturesque pink *château* is located on the last major gravel bank of the Haut Médoc with vineyards that slope down to the edge of the Gironde. Due to its close proximity to the river, Château Loudenne was originally a major port from which many of the famous Bordeaux were shipped before heading out to the Atlantic Ocean.

KEY POINTS

1. Château Loudenne prides itself on the quality of its terroir, which is comprised of exceptional soils of gravel, clay and limestone.
2. The vineyard covers 154 planted acres of Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Cabernet Franc and Petit Verdot, producing a wine that is both expressive and elegant.
3. While this area is known to have a cooler climate than the rest of the Médoc, the river tends to act as a mirror and reflects the warm sun onto the vineyards.
4. 30% of the oak barrels used to make Château Loudenne are replaced each year.
5. World-renowned enologist Michel Rolland is the consulting winemaker.
